INSTRUCTIONAL STRATEGIES AND SUGGESTIONS



- Make eye contact with students.
- · Address students by name.
- Be specific about the behavior that is required or desired.
- Use body language that conveys what you want and expect.
- Stand and wait if necessary.

Instead of Saying:

Pay attention, please...listen.

Put those phones up.

Somebody read #14.

Try Saying:

"Sit up straight and tall. Eyes on me – I need to see you paying attention."

"Turn to your neighbor and say, 'Great job.""

"Pencils down. Eyes on me. I don't want anything to distract you."

"Cease talking."

" , read number 14 aloud for us."

"I need a male volunteer to read the next question."

"Thank you, _____, I appreciate your willingness to participate."

"I see your raised hands. I am waiting for three more students to raise their hands."

"Put your phone face down on your desk."

"School policy requires your phone to be in your backpack. Place it there now and leave it there during today's lesson."
