INSTRUCTIONAL STRATEGIES AND SUGGESTIONS



- Make eye contact with students.
- Address students by name.
- Ask follow-up questions whenever possible.
- Provide ample wait time.

Instead of Saying:

No, that's wrong.



Yeah, that's right.

Try Saying:

"How did you get that answer,?"
"Let me repeat the question: what is?"
"Will you show us where in the text you found this answer,?"
"Please explain how you arrived at this solution,"
"Who can show how to arrive at the correct answer?"
", do you agree with's answer?"
"Class, reread number xx. Now,, what's the key word in the question?"
"Why do you think the answer is D?"
", why did you select answer choice B?"
"Remind me again of the rule for adding fractions with unlike denominators."
"Think back to the experiment we did earlierwhat was the first step?"
